We at Burr Oak Camp look forward to our 61st summer of fun in the relaxed, secure settings of the John Burroughs School and Community School campuses. Especially well-known for swimming instruction, highly qualified instructors meet campers at a level where they feel comfortable. In addition to the swimming program, Burr Oak offers a range of activities tailored to the abilities and interests of each age group.

Preschool Camp

Coeducational groups of four- and five-year-olds who have not yet entered kindergarten enjoy busy days of swimming, games, arts and crafts, and singing. A low student-to-teacher ratio means that campers often get one-on-one attention, especially in the pool. The camp staff, comprised of specialists and college-age counselors, attends to the needs and interests of the young camper to make sure the first camping experience is fun and safe!

Kindergarten Camp

Children who have completed kindergarten are divided by gender into small groups and are led by college-age counselors. In addition to games, arts and crafts, and singing, computer and woodworking classes are offered. Swimming classes continue with highly qualified instructors meeting the young camper at his/her level.

Senior Camp

Campers are divided into small groups according to grade and gender. Swimming, archery, woodworking, team and individual sports, and arts and crafts form the basis of the camp for first through fifth graders. Fourth and fifth grade campers may choose from electives that run the gamut, including cooking, hip-hop, video making and lacrosse (see options on back of application).

Counselors-in-Training

The counselor-in-training program serves students who have completed their sixth grade year. CITs spend half of their day with a group of young campers. They have lunch at senior camp. An educator mentors CITs, and they spend one period a day discussing methods of handling the junior campers. They round out their day with elective activities and recreational swimming.



Woodworking projects are age-appropriate, and counselors are close by to help out when needed.

Location

Preschool and kindergarten campers divide their time between Burroughs and Community School. Community's facilities, located at 900 North Lay Road, include a gymnasium, playground, and wood shop. Older campers spend their entire day on the Burroughs campus, 755 South Price Road, which features a pool, fine arts and woodworking facilities, extensive fields, and an indoor gymnasium. Both campuses are located near I-170 and I-64 in Ladue.

The Camp Day & Extended Day

The camp day runs from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. The morning session of the extended day program begins at 7:30 a.m. and includes a light breakfast. The afternoon session includes a snack and ends at 5:30 p.m.

Lunch

Campers look forward to the hot lunch which is provided as part of the camp day.



Swimming is an important part of the camp day. Staff work with the children, who are grouped according to age and ability.
