Opportunity Description:

John Burroughs school seeks a supportive, collaborative, inspiring, and experienced teacher to join its mathematics department as a full-time member. Burroughs teachers are contagiously passionate about their discipline. They value engaging lessons and understand that meaningful student-teacher relationships are the foundation of all effective instruction.

Full-time math faculty teach five sections, typically with 2-3 preps. Most teachers teach both middle and high school courses. In addition to their teaching and departmental responsibilities, faculty members are expected to participate in the larger life of the school (e.g., attending morning assembly, supervising a lunch table, and advising students). Teachers are also expected to coach or provide leadership in co-curricular areas (e.g., service learning, DEI work, student clubs, or student publications).

Qualifications:

Ideal candidates will have:

- 3-5 five years of experience teaching math studies at the high/middle school level
- A degree in mathematics
- Strong interpersonal skills

- A growth mindset
- Experience working in an intentionally diverse environment, creating an inclusive classroom experience, and supporting students from historically excluded groups.

Files will be reviewed as received with preference given to candidates whose materials are submitted by <u>February 15, 2023.</u>

After reviewing all applications, Chris Front, assistant head of school for academic affairs, and Nicole Randall, chair of the mathematics department, will speak with a select group of applicants over Zoom. Our hope is to complete those Zoom interviews by mid-March. From that group, three to four candidates will be invited to Burroughs for a school day in late March or early April, during which they will teach a class, interview, spend time with students and faculty, and have an opportunity to familiarize themselves with our campus and community.
