## Sign-up Info for Optional AP Exams (English Language and US History)

You already have a College Board account, which was created when taking the PSAT and/or the SAT. It should be under your full, legal name and you should have listed your Burroughs email address.

On a computer or a phone you will go to: MYAP.CollegeBoard.org. If you can't log in because you can't find your log-in information you can use your Burroughs email and then re-set the password. If you still have trouble you can stop into the College Counseling office for assistance. The only thing you should NOT do is to create a new account.

Once you are logged in to the MYAP.CollegeBoard.org site, you'll see a large yellow button that says "Join a Course or Exam". Once you click on that you'll be asked for the "JOIN CODE" for the exam you'd like to sign up for.

These are the codes for the **English Language and Composition** and the **US History** exams:

## English Language and Composition J 4 4 6 4 6

## U.S. History 4 M M 9 R V

These are specific to our school. If this is the first time you've signed up for an AP exam then you will likely be asked a few other questions.

Helpful info: The zip code for our school is 63124

We are not using Student ID numbers – you can leave that blank. You do not have to put in your mobile phone number if you prefer not to. They use them to text you reminders about your exams but you don't have to have that.

Once you enter the Join Code you should see a new screen that confirms that you're signed up. If you don't see the confirming screen then you haven't completed the process. If you want to take both exams then just go on to enter the Join Code for the second one.

Unlike the SAT or ACT sign-ups, there is NO CREDIT CARD information needed in AP sign-ups. You don't pay the College Board directly for these exams. Instead, after the exams are over the charge for the tests you took will appear on your Burroughs Store-Card bill next June. The cost is \$97 per exam. Students must sign up for all exams by Thursday, November 3. Note that if you sign up for an optional AP exam this fall and then elect not to take it in the spring, the College Board charges a \$40 cancellation fee.
