DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSIVITY INITIATIVES: Office established in 1998; Seminar series for 7th-10th grade – weekly program focusing on DEI, health, and social-emotional learning; 23 DEI student groups; AFS International Student Exchange partner; Grading for Equity; Student body includes 47% students of color; 25% of students receive tuition aid, with average grant of \$23,563.

ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS: Grades 9-12: Virtually all seniors will earn credits listed below.

At least 75% will earn 4 credits in each academic discipline.

Promotion/Graduation Requirements: "C-" average in at least 4 Academic Courses each year.

Honors courses and AP Physics and Computer Science are offered in only Junior and Senior years. Other AP courses are offered only in the Senior year. Students are permitted to take only 3 Honors and/or AP courses each year (indicated by H or AP on transcript).

Honors and AP Courses Offered: English IV; French IV; German IV; Latin IV and V; Spanish IV; Pre-Calculus; Foundations of Western Literature; AP Calculus AB & BC; AP Computer Science; AP Biology; AP Chemistry; AP Physics 1 & 2; AP Environmental Science; AP French; AP German; and AP Spanish.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Burroughs does not emphasize the AP Program and does not offer AP courses in many disciplines. However, the rigor of our program does prepare students to take a number of AP exams. * Indicates those subjects for which we do not offer AP courses.
